

USBC GENDER CLASSIFICATION POLICY FREQUESNTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

USBC has created the following Frequently Asked Questions to provide guidance for competitions wanting transgender female inclusion within the current policy.

Can a historically women's league allow transgender females to bowl in its league? A historically women's league that votes to allow transgender athletes compete must certify as a mixed league moving forward. While leagues are invitational by nature and by rule can determine the makeup of the league, USBC must comply with USOPC directives and therefore a women's league must be comprised of only biological females. To change to a mixed league, the league would, by majority vote, adopt a rule the league is open to women and transgender females and when they certify the league, mark it as a mixed league.

What does a tournament need to do to allow transgender females to compete with biological females in its competition? A tournament manager would need a rule creating a mixed division restricting participation to females and transgender females.

How can leagues be more inclusive for everyone?

The easiest way is for leagues to be open without specific gender categories or awards. Mixed leagues without specific rules such as a minimum number of women on a team may be unaffected by the updated policy.
